

FIRE DEPARTMENT REGULATIONS

1. All applicable codes and ordinances shall apply, including but not limited to, the Uniform Fire Code; California Code of Regulations, Title 19; and those portions of California Code of Regulations, Title 24, adopted by the State Fire Marshal.
2. A minimum 36" separation shall be provided between tents/canopies/pavilions. A Fire Department permit shall be required for tents/pavilions greater than 200 square feet and canopies greater than 400 square feet. This includes tents/pavilions and/or canopies that are joined together which exceed the maximum allowable area permissible without a permit. Requests for a tent permit shall be made to the Fire Department a minimum of seven working days prior to the proposed event. A separate permit shall be obtained for each tent/pavilion/canopy. The permit fee is \$76.00 payable to "City of Big Bear Lake Fire Department". For specific information on permit requirements, the applicant may call the Fire Department at 909-866-7566.
3. Each vendor shall have a minimum of one 2-A:10-B:C fire extinguisher, mounted in a visible and accessible location and no higher than 5'. Each fire extinguisher shall have a current California State Fire Marshal service tag and not be over 12 years of age. A Fire Department permit will be required for open fires such as a fire ring, camping stove, candles, etc. Fire Department permits shall be obtained a minimum of seven working days prior to proposed event. For specific information on permit requirements, the applicant may call the Fire Department at 909-866-7566.
4. Straw/hay used inside canopies/tents/pavilion shall be required to be treated with an approved fire retardant, subject to testing by the Fire Department.
5. If extension cords/generator are proposed for use an electrical distribution plan shall be submitted to the Fire Department for review and approval a minimum of seven days prior to event. Electrical wiring installation shall be in accordance with the National Electrical Code.
6. The use of black powder or other pyrotechnic materials will require a Fire Department permit. Requests for a pyrotechnic permit shall be obtained a minimum of seven working days prior to proposed event. For specific information on permit requirements, the applicant may call the Fire Department at 909-866-7566.
7. No smoking will be permitted inside the event site. A designated smoking area, subject to Fire Department approval, shall be provided near the front entrance. The smoking area shall be clearly identified. Non-combustible buckets, containing sand or water, shall be provided for the disposal of smoking materials. "No Smoking" signage shall be prominently displayed throughout the event site.
